ATLANTIC FISH

BLACK BASS

▼ MARKET SOFTENING

Medium market has softened as pot/trap and hook and line season are in full swing on the East Coast. Large and jumbo pricing remains high into the summer. Fish from Ocean City, MD.

ATLANTIC FISH

FRESH FLOUNDER

▲ PRICES RISING

Trawl vessels have switched to squid fishing in local canyons. Availability will remain sporadic; pricing stays elevated as we rely on northern day boat fish.

ATLANTIC FISH

WILD STRIPED BASS

▲ AVAILABILITY UP

Maryland fishing continues to pick up with smaller fish more available. Rhode Island closed; MA and NY still open harvesting 8 lbs and up fish.

SOUTHERN FISH

MAHI

▲ PRICES HIGH

No changes in the market this week. Prices remain high on all imported product.

GREAT LAKES

LAKE FISH

▼ AVAILABILITY DOWN

Decreased availability for all 3 primary species — Walleye, White Bass, and White Perch — as we head into the final weeks of the fresh spring season.

SOUTHERN FISH

YELLOWFIN TUNA

▲ PRICES RISING

Limited landings this week pushing prices upward. Yellowfins arriving from Louisiana, Costa Rica, and Ecuador.

SOUTHERN FISH

SWORDFISH

▲ PRICES RISING

Marker and double marker swords arriving from Canada, Costa Rica, and the Gulf. Prices rising due to limited landings. Great grilling fish option!

ATLANTIC FISH

ATLANTIC HALIBUT

▼ STABLE

Pricing is stable; availability slightly low with most landings being 10-50 lb fish. Smaller vessels fishing closer to shore this week.

SHELLFISH

LIVE LOBSTER

▲ PRICES RISING

Market met with uncertainty. Domestic wholesalers struggle to maintain inventory; pricing trending upward as supply relies on Canadian product. Competition for product on shore has intensified.

WILD KING SALMON

▼ PRICES EASING

Troll prices should slide down a bit at the end of this week. Fish arriving from Ketchikan and Wrangell in southeast Alaska.

WILD SALMON

WILD ALASKAN SOCKEYE

▲ SEASON EXPANDING

Copper River closed for both openers last week awaiting higher king escapement. Other areas now open — Prince William Sound, Cook Inlet, and southeast AK sockeye runs beginning this week.
